


- 26.4% of Kentucky's Veterans have a service connected disability rating



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


## **Rural Kentucky Numbers**

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Veteran Health Risks (a tiny picture)
Almost 50% of veterans enrolled in VA health care have Insomnia Disorder - Insomnia disorder is also linked to cardiovascular disease, obesity, and diabetes
Almost 20% of Iraq and Afghanistan veterans suffer from post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) or major depression.
1 in 3 women and 1 in 50 men respond "yes," that they experienced military sexual trauma (MST) when surveyed by their VA provider
In 2020, suicide rate for Veterans was 57.3% greater than for non-Veteran U.S. adults

#### Study

Large FQHC in lowa went from 56 or .32% of patients reporting as veterans to 506 or 3.01% after changing screening question.
